Honors World History Syllabus

Course Description:

This is a Sophomore-level class that is a comprehensive course in World History covering both famous and ordinary changes in societies around the world from the Renaissance to the present. Additionally, a review of ancient and medieval societies is presented as well as units on Islam and contemporary genocide. By studying the past, you can understand not only the past, but the contributions to the present world you live in today.

As this is an honors level class (grade will be weighted both quarters along with the final exam in May), there will be a great deal of high level reading and writing. Homework will be assigned once a week (approximately) but you should anticipate spending at least 3 hours per week outside of class on this subject.

Materials Needed:

- **BINDER** (loose leaf and dividers inside)
- Bring to class EVERYDAY: textbook, writing utensil, binder

Grading System:

• Grades will be based on a variety of different activities such as: homework, quizzes, tests, assignments, current events magazine, notebook/binder, small group work projects & a research paper. Assignments are given a point value based on their level of difficulty.

Absentee Information:

- It is the student's responsibility to get all make-up work from classes missed.
